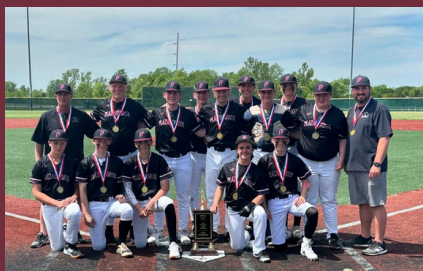
SPIRITUAL IMPACT

- During the high school mission trip to Arlington, Texas students were able to share the gospel with people from different religious backgrounds, help those in need, and be a part of some choosing to follow Christ.
- PHCA raised around \$11,000 for our Zambian mission partner, Chozi School, to build a new school facility.
- Approximately 25 students made some type of decision to follow Christ.
- Fall Retreat was instrumental in changing PHCA culture. We saw students embrace leadership roles which helped set the state for spiritual revival.
- PHCA hosted the Student Awakening Revival in the spring which was attended by over 100 students and included local church partners.
- Students in grades K-12 read through the entire Gospel of John.



ACADEMICS

- Average ACT score of 22.4, which is higher than most local public schools and the same as other local college prep private schools
- Had our highest PreK- 12th grade enrollment with 335 students
- Implemented I-Ready, a diagnostic tool used to build customized lesson plans for K-5 students
- 12 seniors qualified for the A+ scholarship.
- 78% of graduating seniors were college bound.
- 12 members of National Honor Society, a respected organization for high school students that recognizes and promotes excellence in 4 key areas
- Developed our own secondary Bible curriculum and plan for students to complete set courses prior to graduation



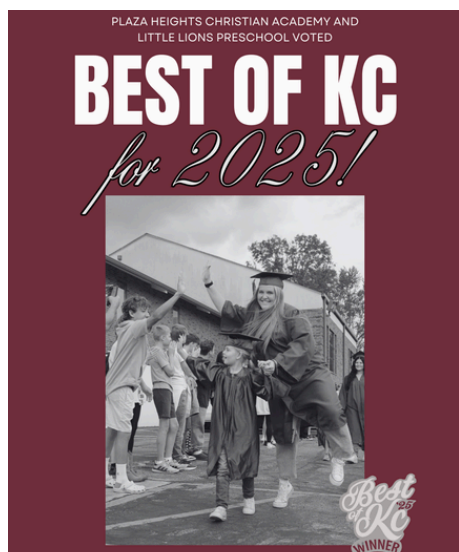
ATHLETICS

- Won a State Championship title in Boys' Soccer, Cheerleading, Golf, and Baseball
 - Boys' Soccer won both the conference and the tournament in the MOKAN division.
 - Remi Schieber, Reece Cornine, and Luke Jones were inducted into the 1000 point club for basketball.
 - Varsity Boys' basketball won a 5th straight MOKAN regular season title, and both the Boys and Girls Varsity won the MOKAN tournament title.

FINE ARTS

- Middle school students presented “The Entire American Revolution in 40 Minutes or Less” in the fall, with about 150 tickets sold.
- Students in 2nd -12th grades performed “Seussical the Musical”, which sold hundreds of tickets!
- Five students participated in the Fine Arts Festival in Speech, with 4 out of 5 receiving a 1 rating. Two students received the highest markings of all middle school students in attendance (100 / 100) on their duet performance.
- Six students participated in the Fine Arts Festival in Vocal Music, with 2 students receiving a 1 rating.
- 41 students participated in the Midwest Fine Arts Festival.
- There were a total of 3 art shows throughout the year; 2 showcasing middle and high school art, and one showcasing elementary art projects.



AWARDS AND CELEBRATIONS

- PHCA celebrated 25 years of excellence in Christian education in the 2024-2025 school year. The celebration culminated with a gala held at Berry Acres that was attended by 150 past and present staff, faculty, parents, and donors.
- PHCA was voted Best Private School by KC Magazine.
- Little Lions Preschool was voted “Best Preschool” by KC Magazine.
- PHCA was listed in the top 25 private schools in Kansas City in the KC Business Journals’ Book of Lists.

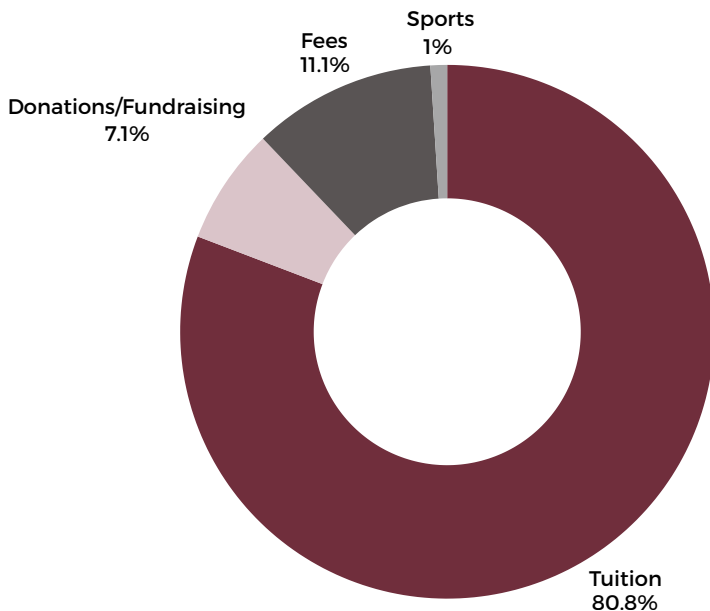

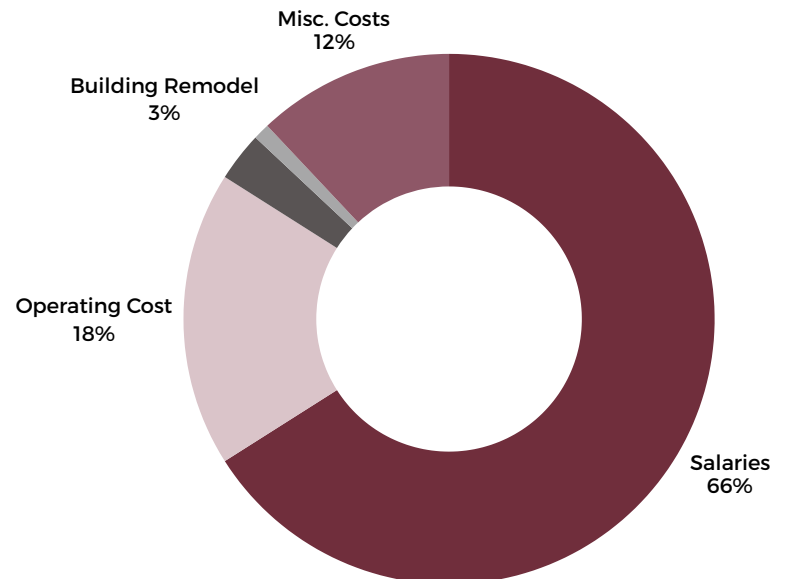
